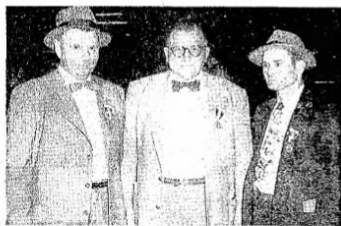

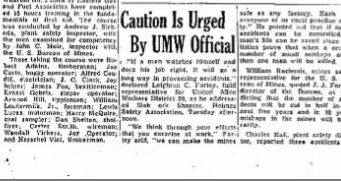

55,000 May View Mining Machines At Bluefield Show

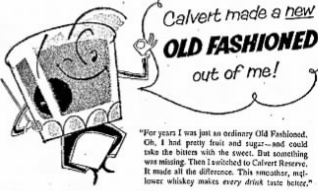
