

Rescue team doubles up on championship

Emery Mining Corporation's Mine Rescue and First Aid Team won first place championship trophy for Combination Mine Rescue and First Aid at the National Mine Rescue and First Aid Contest in Louisville, Kentucky, September 25, 1981.

The team in addition placed second in the First Aid Contest and third in the Mine Rescue.

They were competing against approximately 120 of the finest teams in the nation in what has been called the "World Series of Mine Rescue."

The contest is held every other year in Louisville. It has been running for 30 years. This is the first time any one has repeated as

champions. E.M.C. first won the Championship Combination Mine Rescue and First Aid contest in 1979.

The Mine Safety and Health Administration sponsors the 3-day contest as a test of the skills of the teams in event of an emergency. They hope that they never need those skills but in case they do it's nice to know that we have such a sharp team ready to go into action.
