

Big Island wins rescue contest

LAS VEGAS – A Green River trona mine captured top honors at a mine rescue contest.

A team from OCI's Big Island Mine captured the firstplace award at the National and International Mine Rescue Contest, sponsored by the U.S. Department of Labor's Mine Safety and Health Administration.

Second place went to a team from the Westinghouse Waste Isolation Pilot Plant in Carlsbad, New Mexico. Third place went to FMC, another Green River mine.

The contest, held last month, requires six-member teams to solve a hypothetical mine emergency problem such as a fire, explosion or cave-in. Teams are judged on their adherence to mine rescue procedures and how quickly they complete specific tasks.
