
Hazards of Confined Spaces in mining.

- 9. Asphyxiation












Oxygen in the Air

Above 23.5% Oxygen supports the combustion process and increases fire and flash potential.

23.5% To 19.5%

19.5 -23.5% - Acceptable range.

- Less than 19.5% Oxygen begins the process to affect the breathing cycle in humans.
- 16% Humans become dizzy, disoriented, and pass out.
